Flora and Fauna Protection

The Hansen Yuncken HYer Standards provide guidance on the minimum level of compliance expected for high risk activities on all projects.

Tree Protection Zones (TPZ)



- Identify any vegetation or Tree Protection Zones (TPZs) in accordance with environmental or landscaping specifications/drawings
- Protect TPZs with solid physical barriers during Site Establishment
- Prohibit parking, washing, material storage, and soil level changes within TPZs
- Inspect integrity of TPZ controls during environmental or HSE site inspections

Biosecurity Considerations



- Understand and comply with biosecurity zone requirements, including interstate zones
- Ensure any site-specific considerations are included in the Environmental Management Plan and communicated in the Site-Specific Induction
- Inspect imported timber and products for pests and report any signs immediately to the appropriate authority
- Visually inspect and wash vehicles and equipment to prevent the spread of pests, weeds, and diseases

Working Near Wildlife



- Identify areas with significant wildlife and ensure control measures are included in the Environmental Management Plan and communicated during the Site-Specific Induction
- If significant species are identified on-site, create no-go zones at safe distances to protect wildlife
- Keep the site clean and free of litter to prevent harm to wildlife

Emergency Procedures



- If wildlife is unexpectedly encountered or there is accidental damage to protected vegetation, wildlife, or their habitats, stop work immediately and notify the Site Manager
- Site Manager to contact local environmental authorities, nearest vet, or wildlife rescue service and follow guidance from authorities or wildlife rescue
- HY Project team is to consult with experts for corrective actions if required
